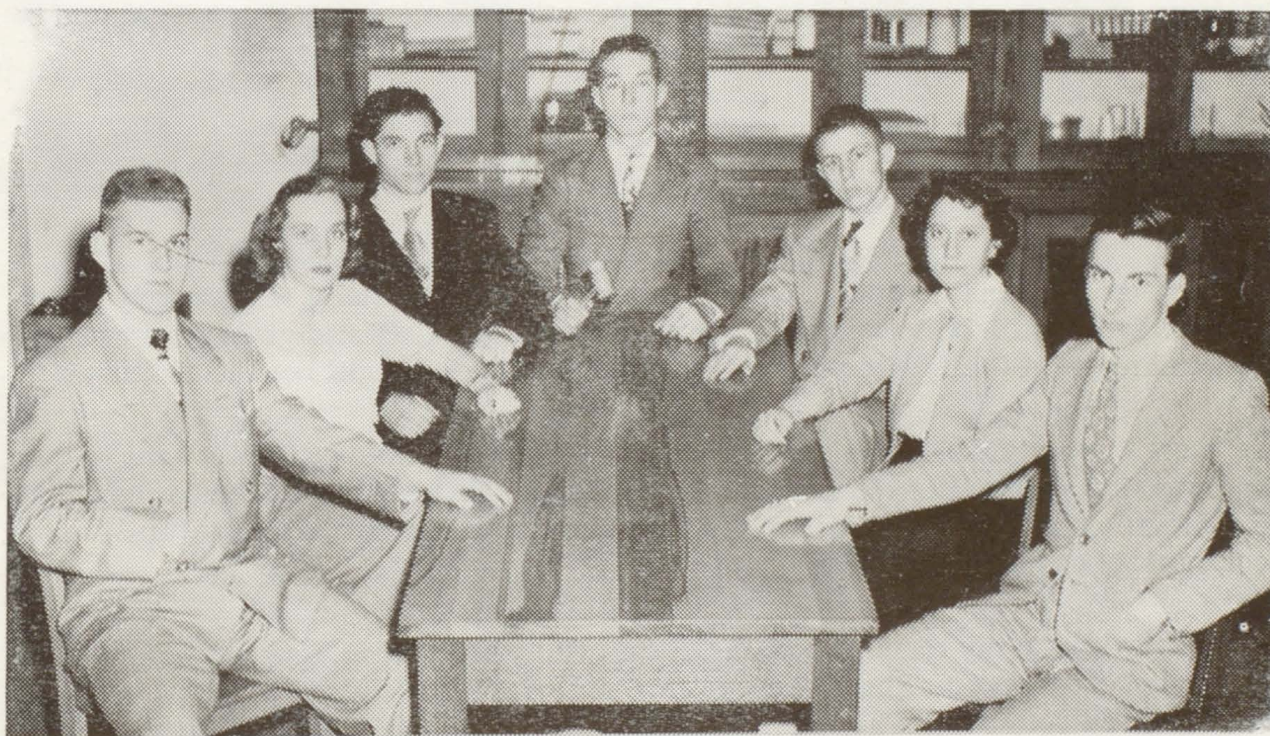

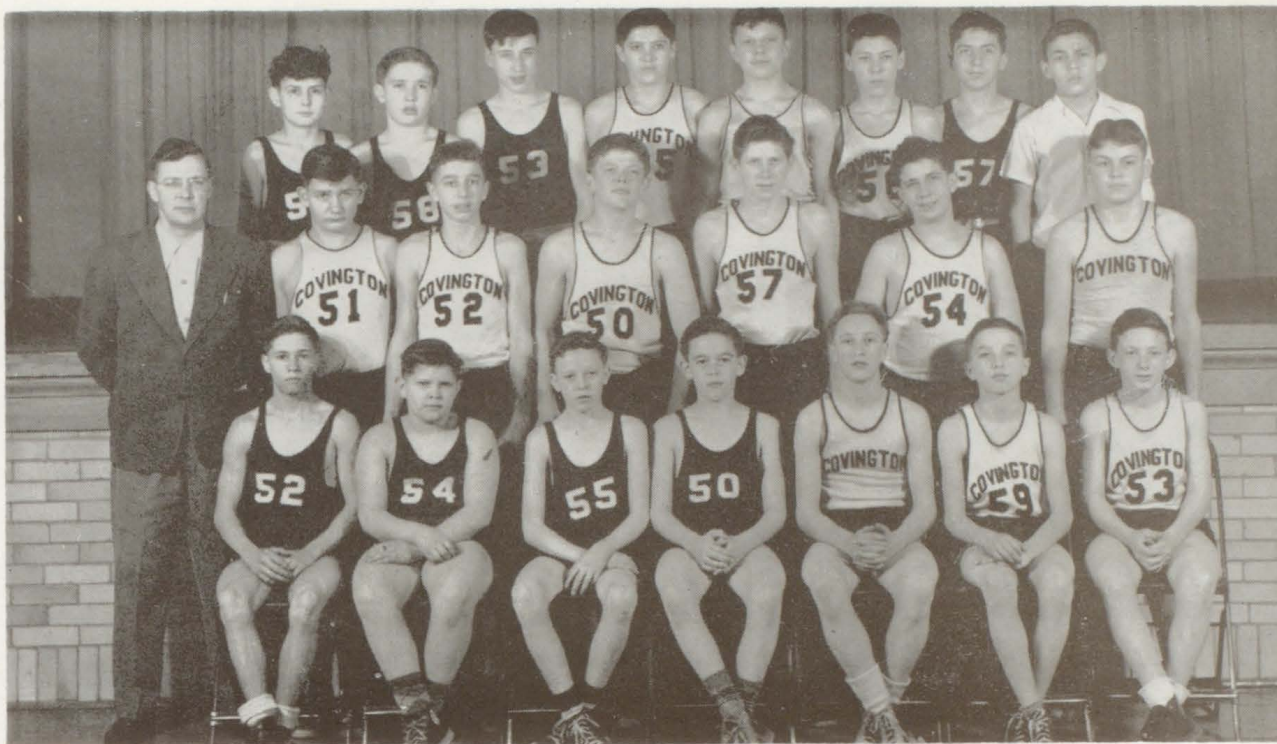

Nancy, a junior, is the only blonde. She is 5'3" tall and has blue eyes. Nancy has been a cheerleader for three years.

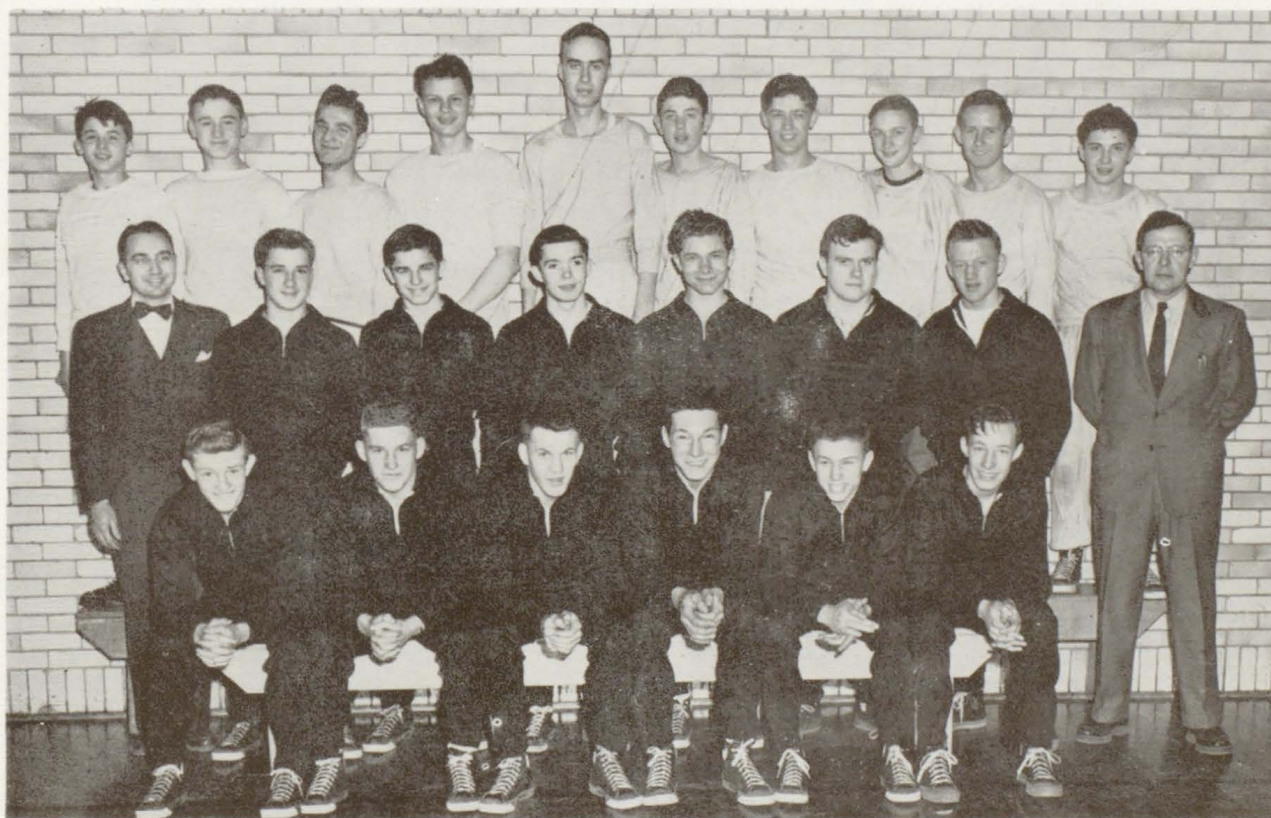

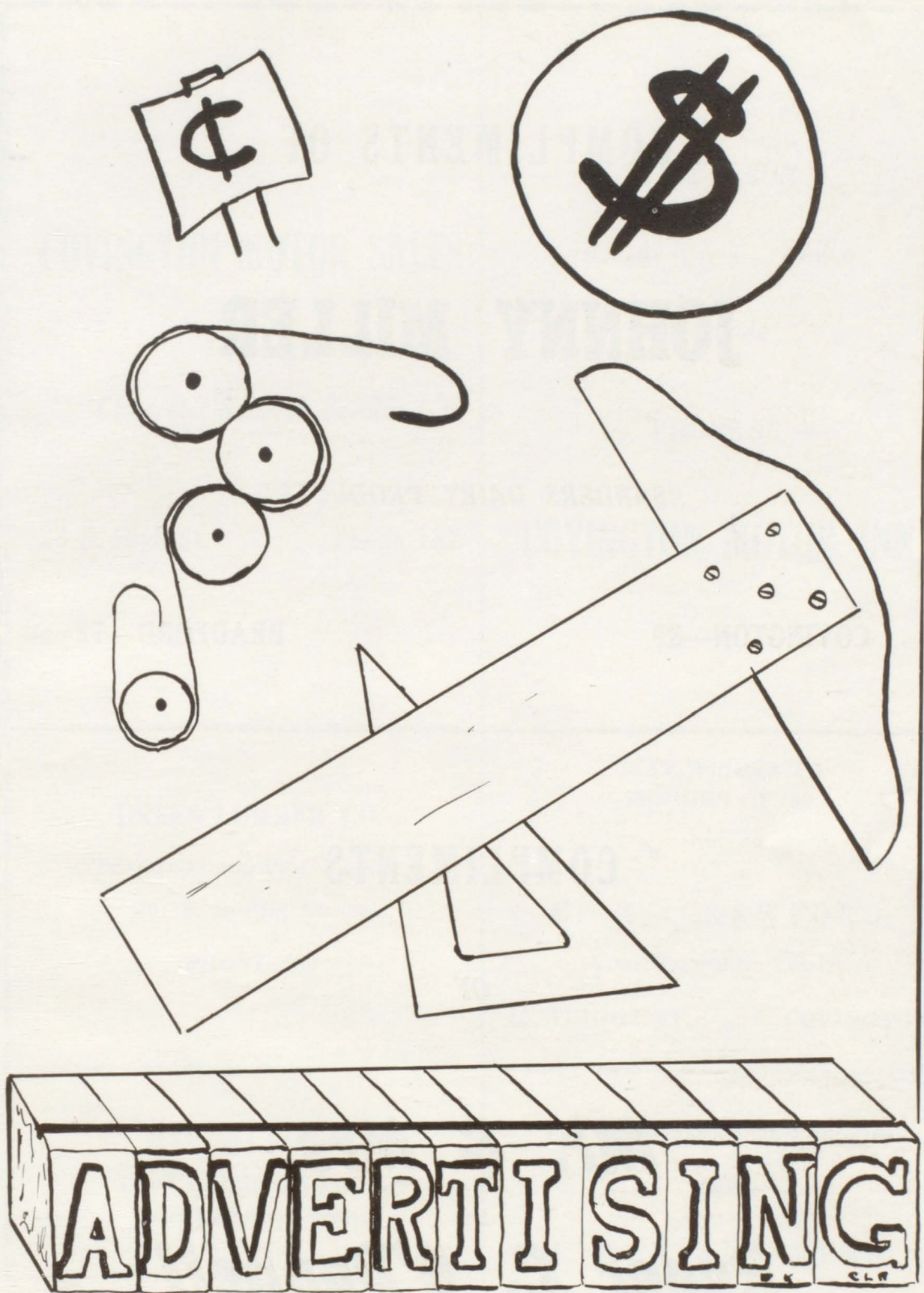
