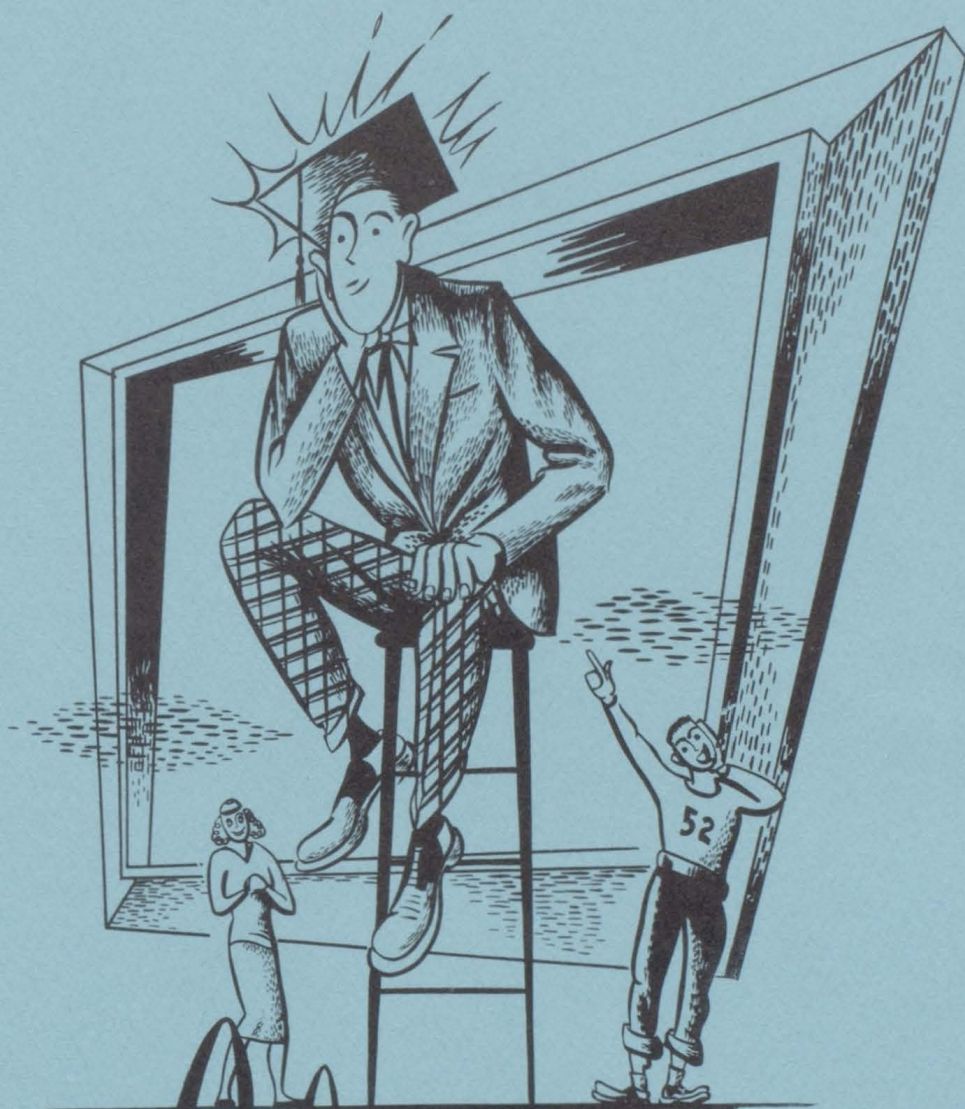
Next morning I took off for my home in Somewhere. To sum up my trip, I certainly enjoyed it.

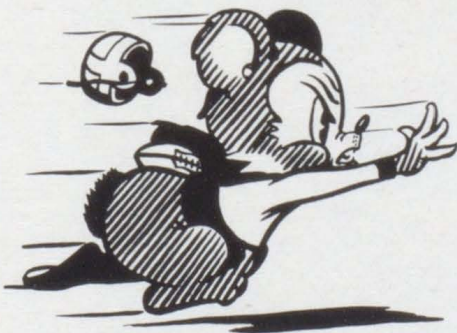
