
Future Homemakers of America

Vocal music is divided into four groups, freshman, sophomore, junior, and senior. Although they do not meet at the same time, most classes enjoy singing the same songs.



On January 29, eight seniors traveled to Troy High School to take the Senior Scholarship Test. They competed with 150 other seniors in Miami County.




Buccaneer Basketball Team
