




Nothing is more uniquely American than local control of public education through boards of education composed of lay citizens.

School board members represent the people who own and support the schools. They form a grass roots organization which is closer to the people than any other form of government. They spend the local taxpayers' money and are responsible to their neighbors for the action. They are trustees of a great public responsibility.

The American school board has served to keep the public schools an immediate possession of the people. It has served as a prime protection against the domination of schools by an "ism" or any centralized pattern for remodeling society. Our schools began as local institutions; school boards keep them that way.

The biggest project confronting the school board this year was the building project. The progress was delayed due to not getting supplies to work with, and also due to the bad weather conditions.

Mr. Stubbs has been Superintendent since 1953. We appreciate the many things he has done for the school and community.




Mr. Apwisch, has been with us as principal for four years. Through his untiring efforts we have all benefitted in many ways.

This is the second year for the club in Covington High School and we have improved quite a bit since our first few meetings. We are better organized and plan things more fully.






Buccaneer Basketball Jeam


