



A Message From the Editor





Aren't you glad that you live in the United States of America?





Track - '65


The 1965 Track team completed a very successful season this year. The Buccs won the Covington Invitational over the other 11 schools participating.

Two other boys placed in the district this year. Ted Peacock tied for third in the pole vault and Steve Folkerth received 5th in the shot put.




