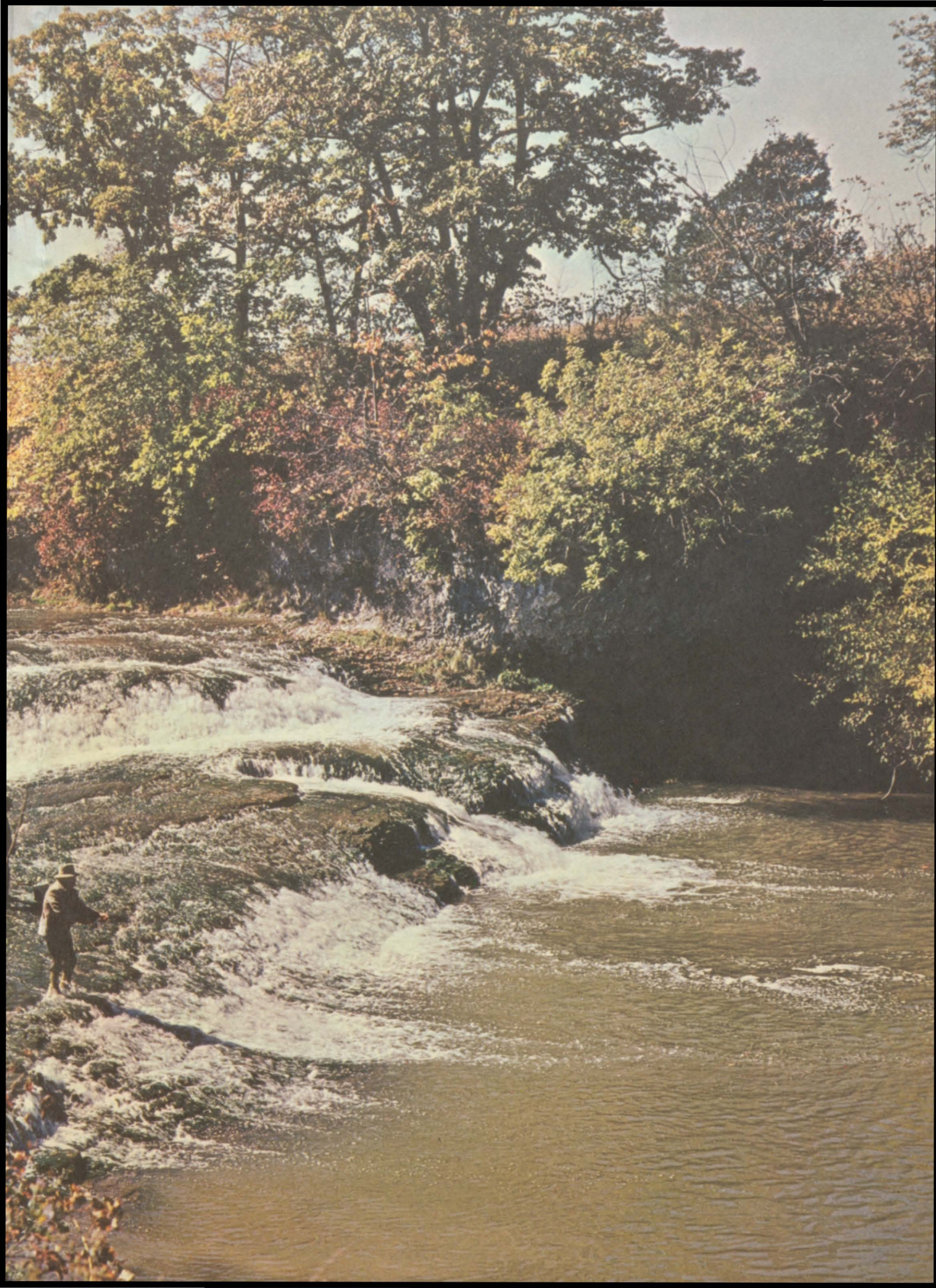

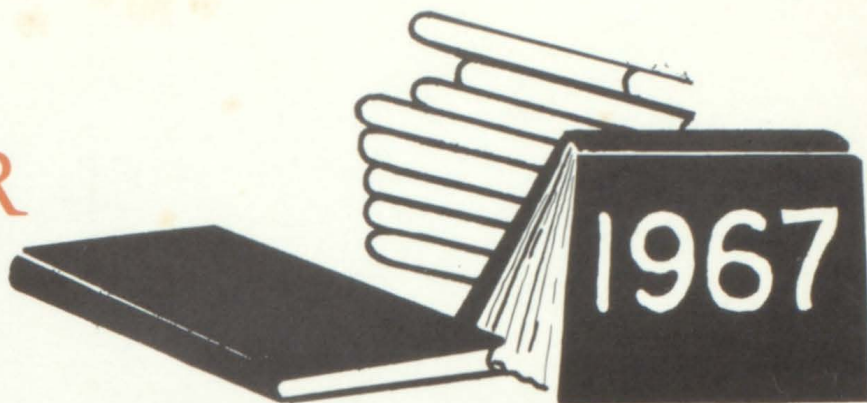

A Message From The Editor

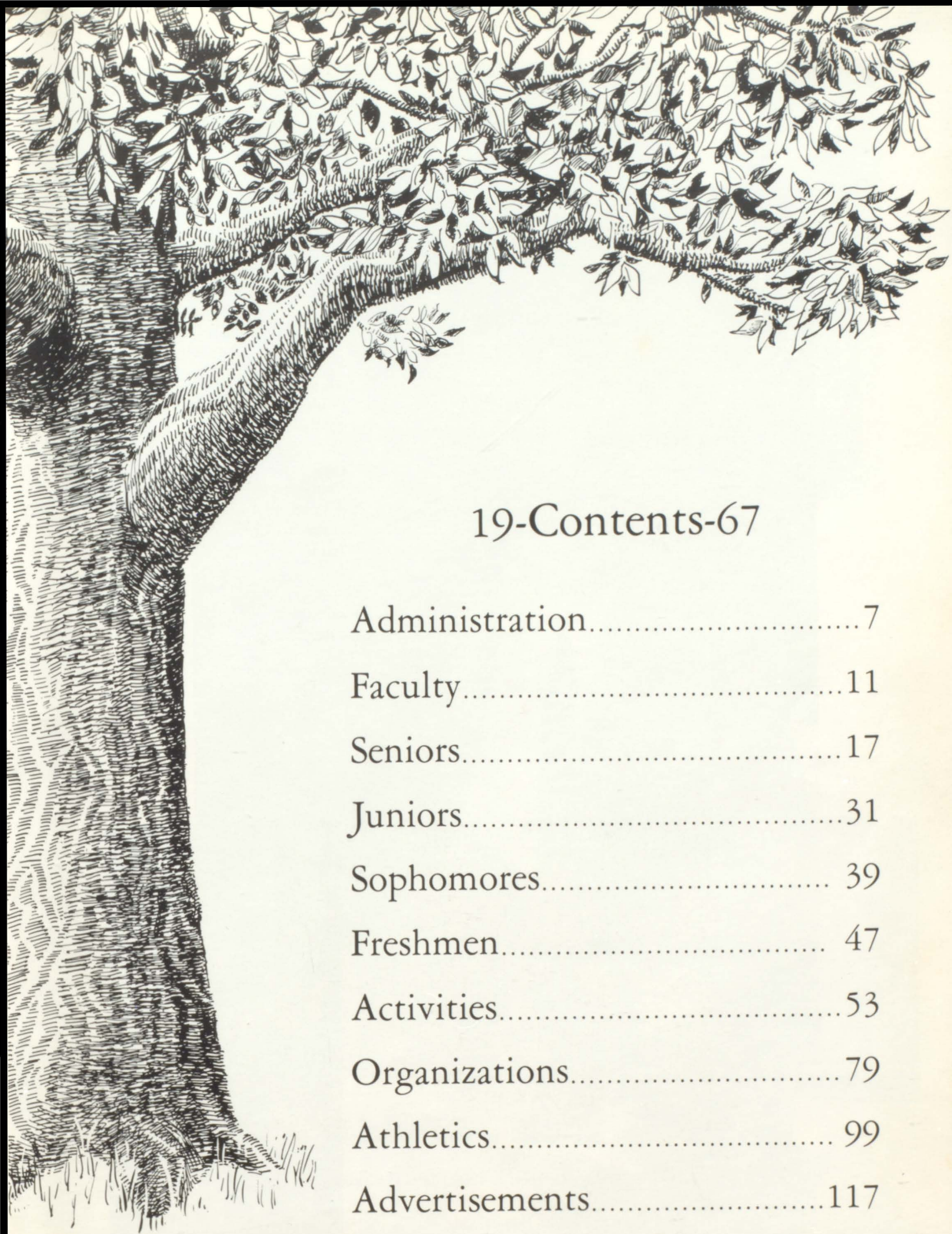

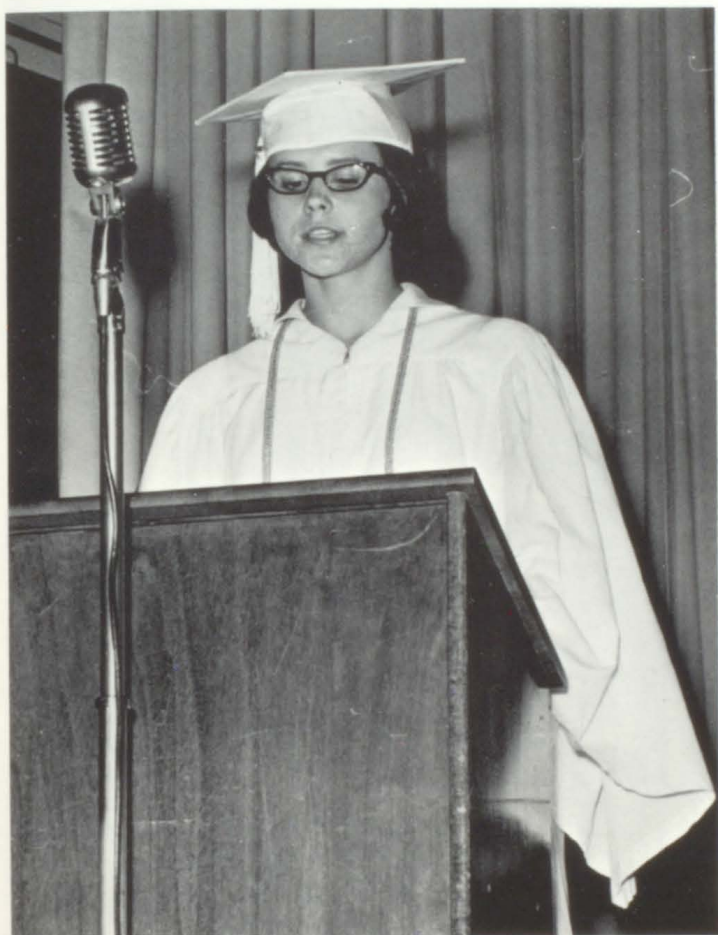
PROGRAM

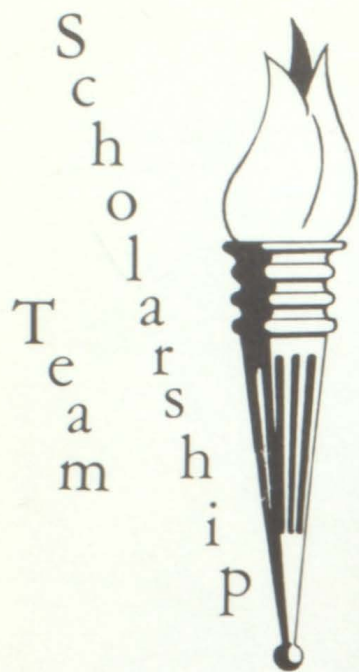
Inspiring Inductions . . .

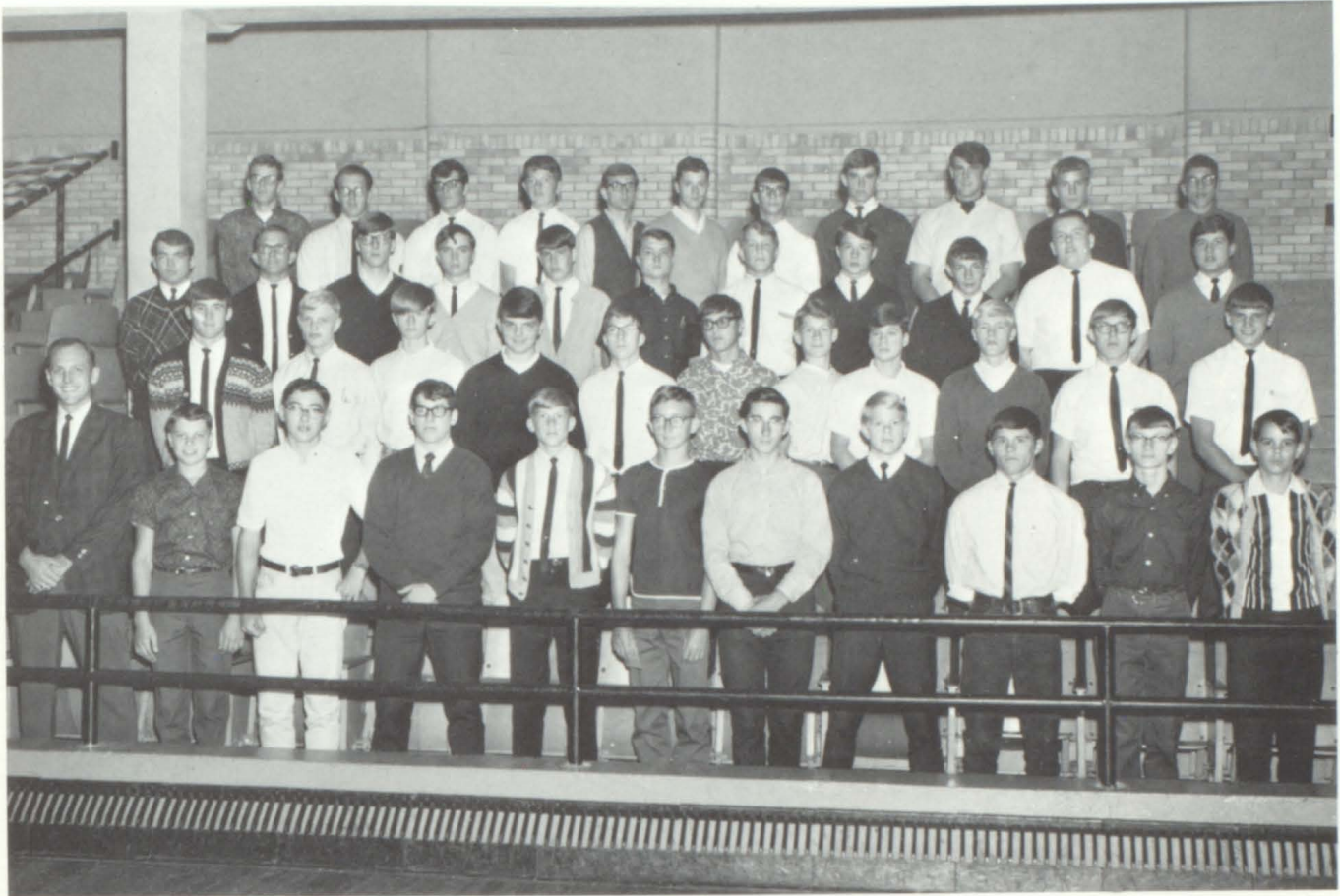

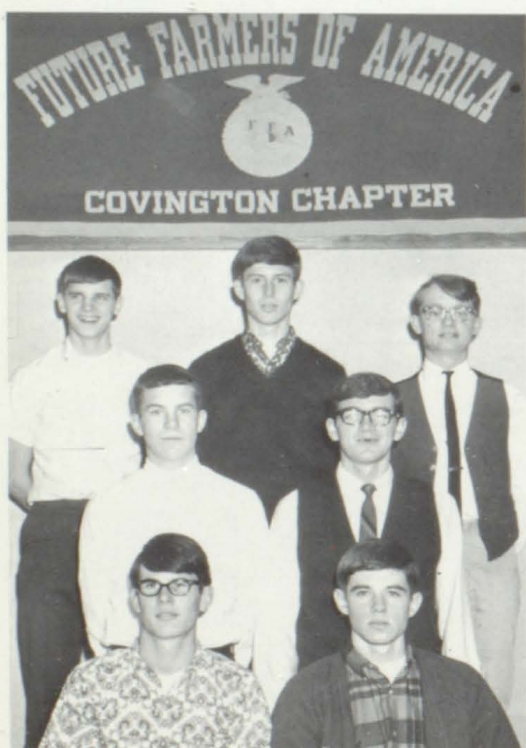

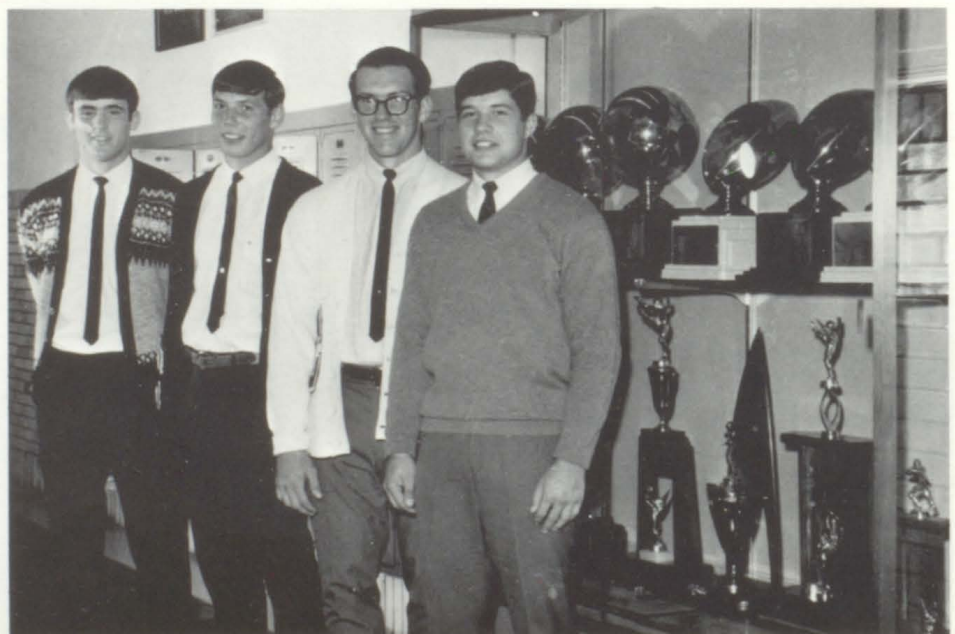

The Key Club strived for new activities this year, but accomplished only a few of them. They are looking forward to a better year during the 1967-68 school year.

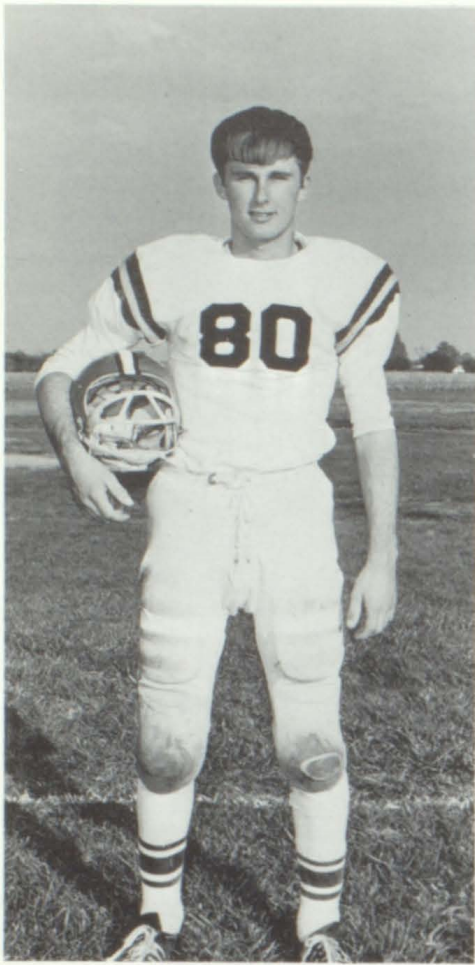
