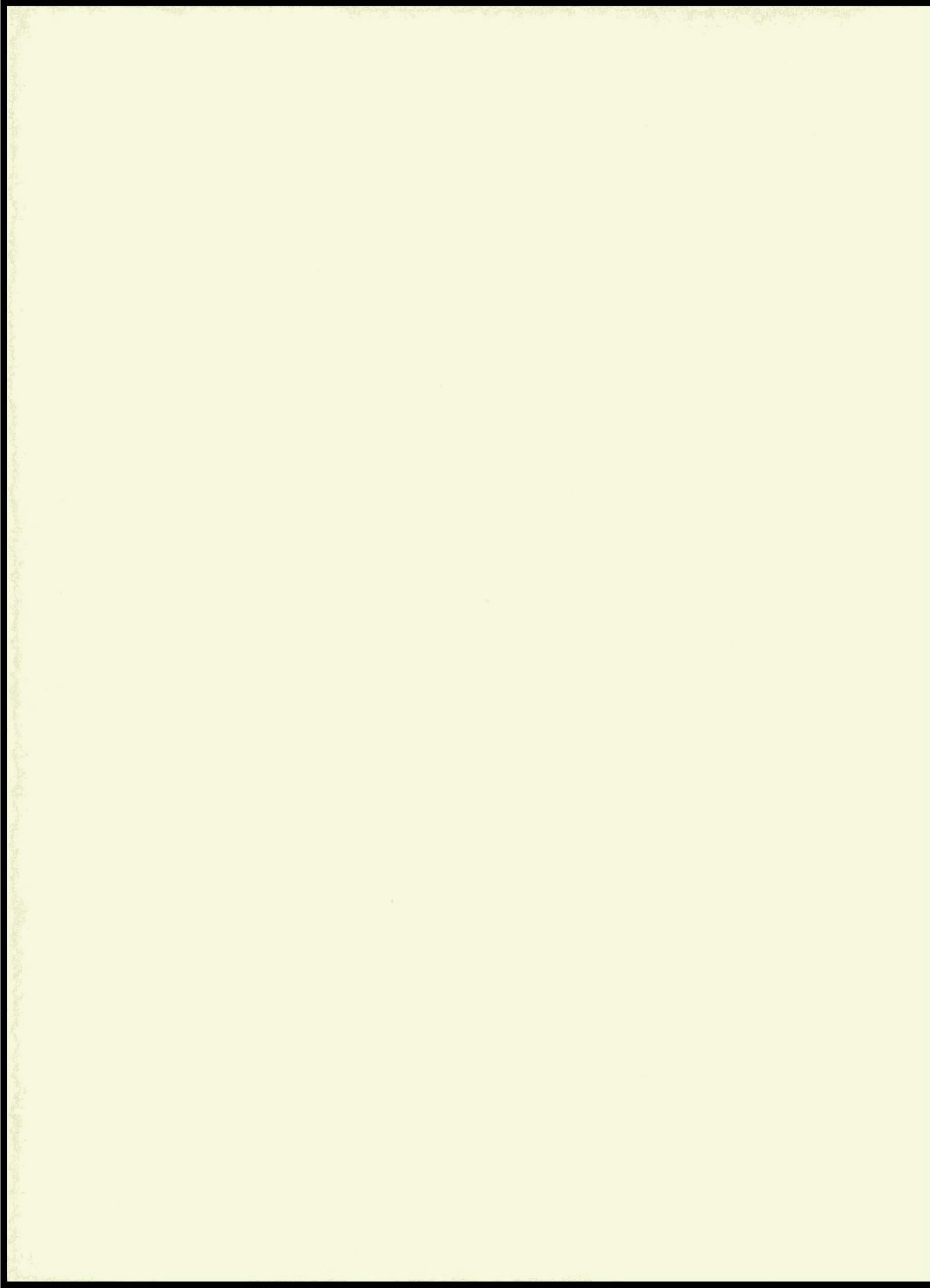

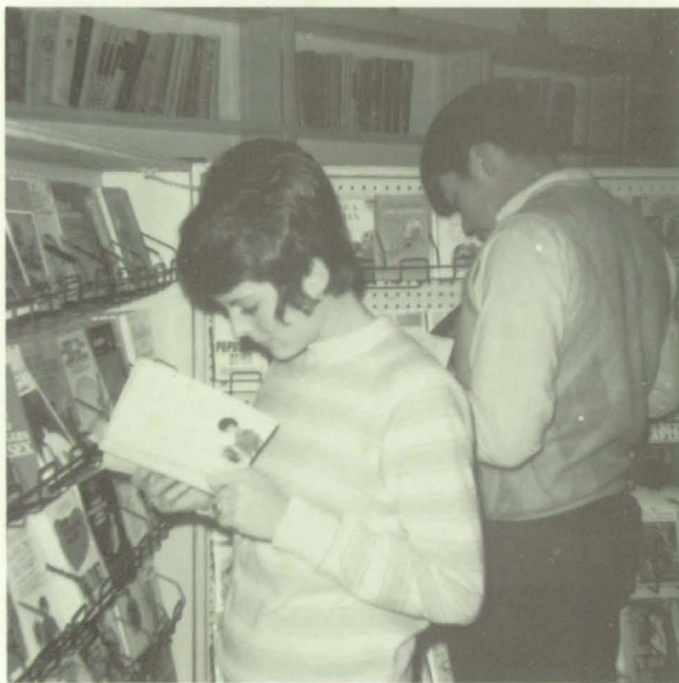
DEDICATION

Linda Crist, the valedictorian, then gave her address entitled "Peace - The Right Direction." "Let There Be Peace on Earth," the class song, was sung by the class. Mr. Blair Irvin, principal, presented the class of 1971. Diplomas were then presented by Lowell Yingst. The class sang their last song together, the "Alma Mater" and Benediction was given by the Rev.
