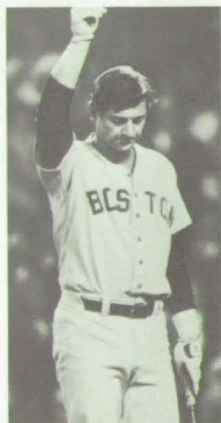

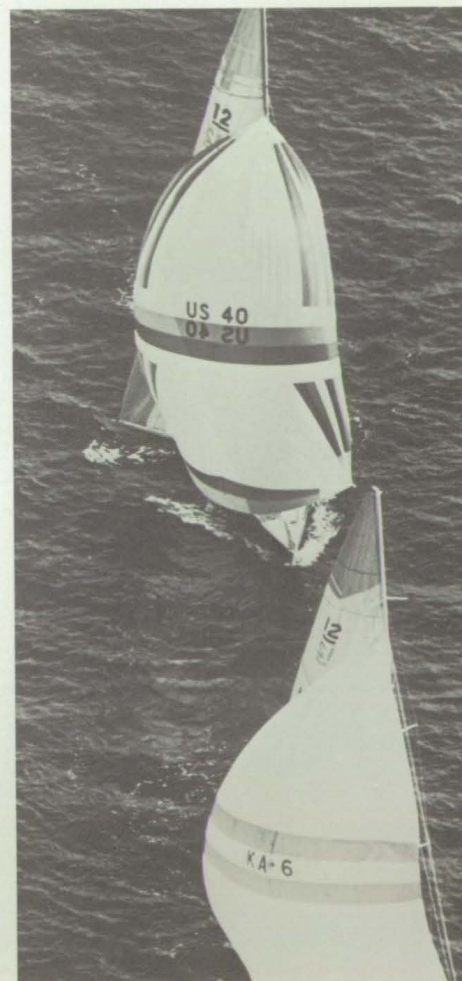
Lillian Carter, mother of former president Jimmy Carter, died at 85. David Niven, well-known British actor also died.

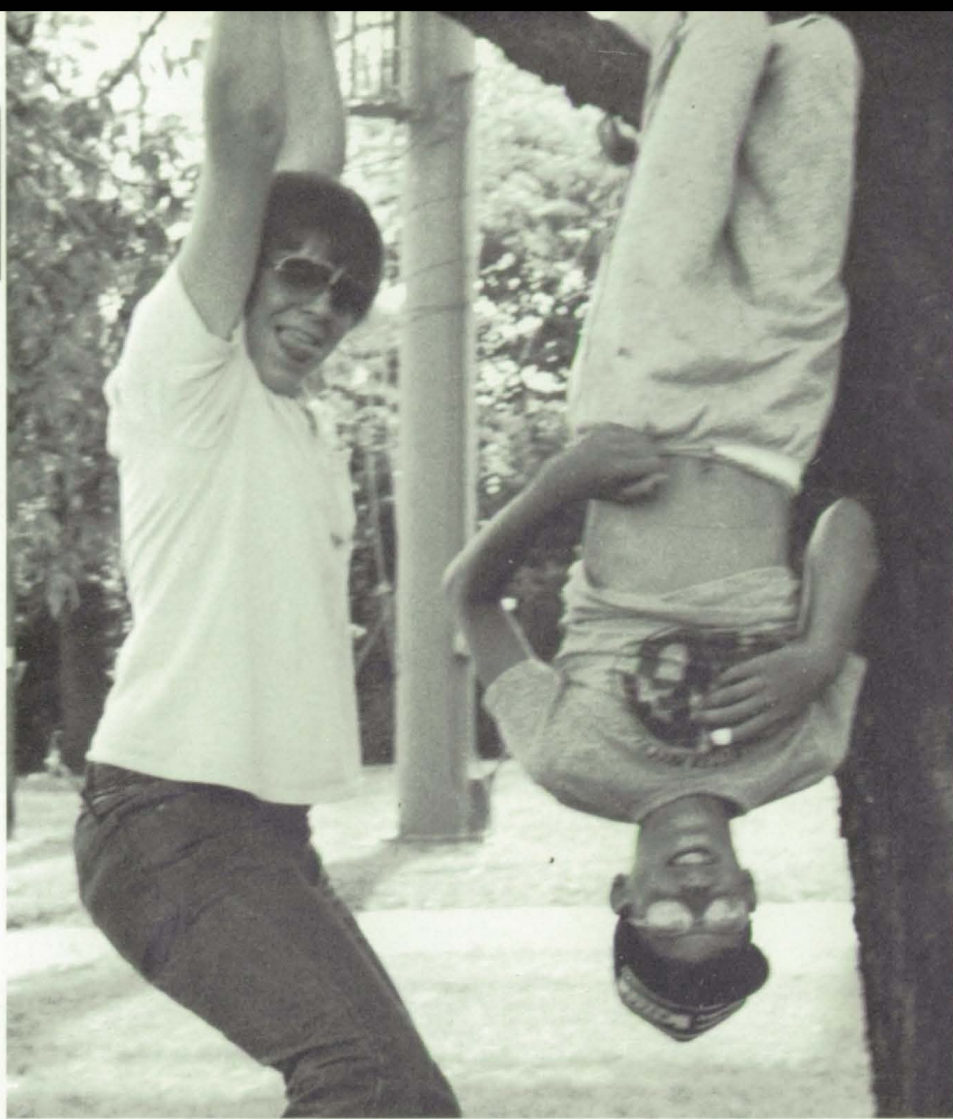
Band camp was held at Bluffton College the week of July 25-29. As the band prepared for their show, they also did fundamentals, memorized their music, and also had a skit night.

On October 28 there were all sorts of strange things roaming the halls of CHS ranging from ghosts and ghouls to nerds and mice.

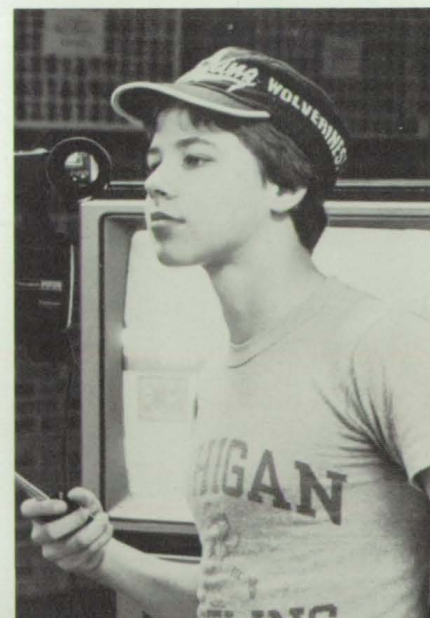
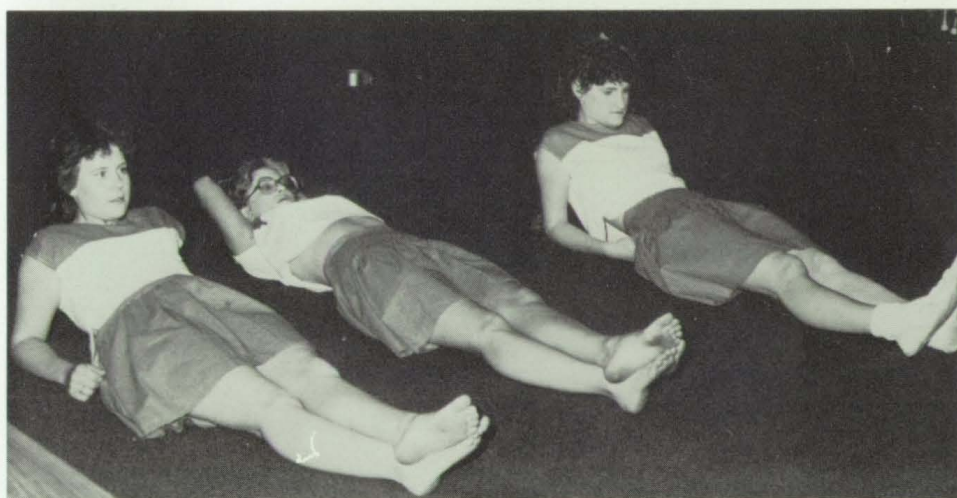

The reserve team finished the season with a 5-2-2 record.

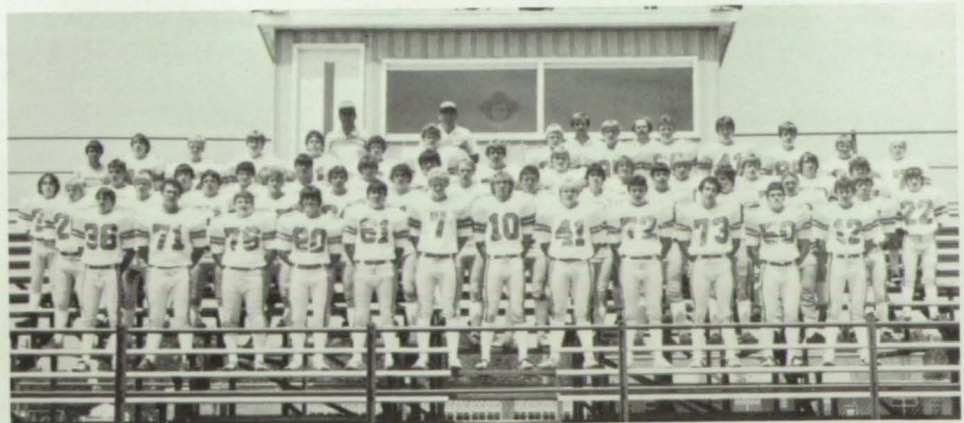


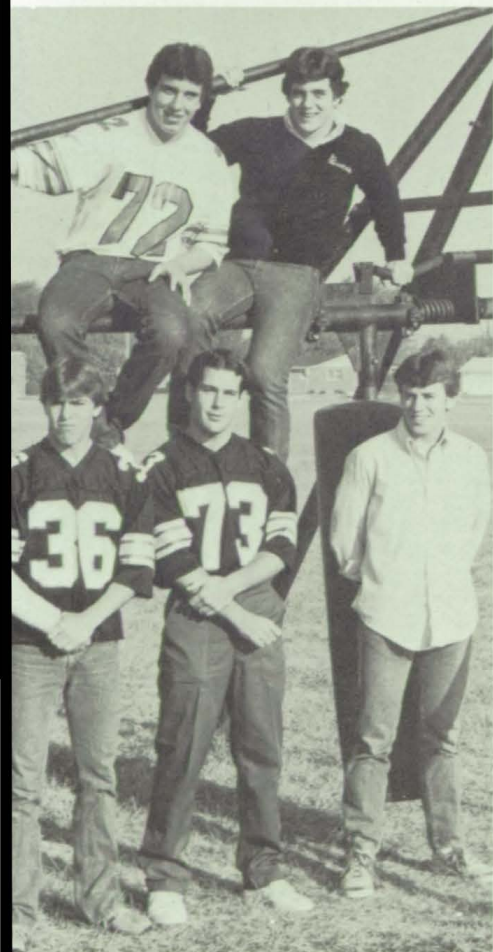
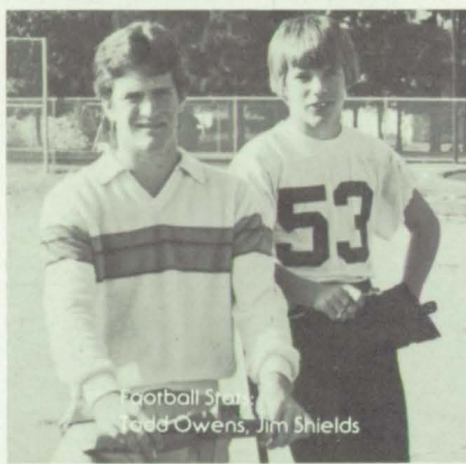
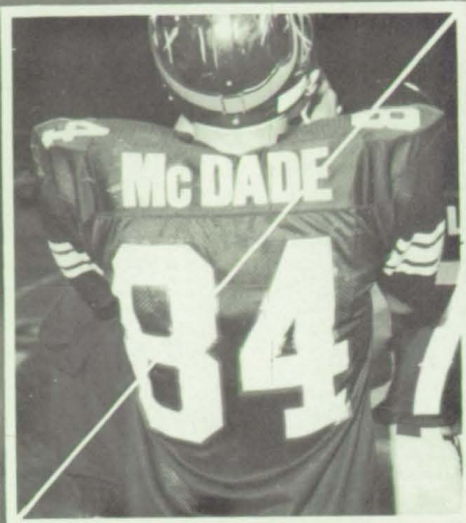
