1989 also saw C.H.S. having its first girls team. The girls played two matches and are looking forward to having a complete schedule in the future.

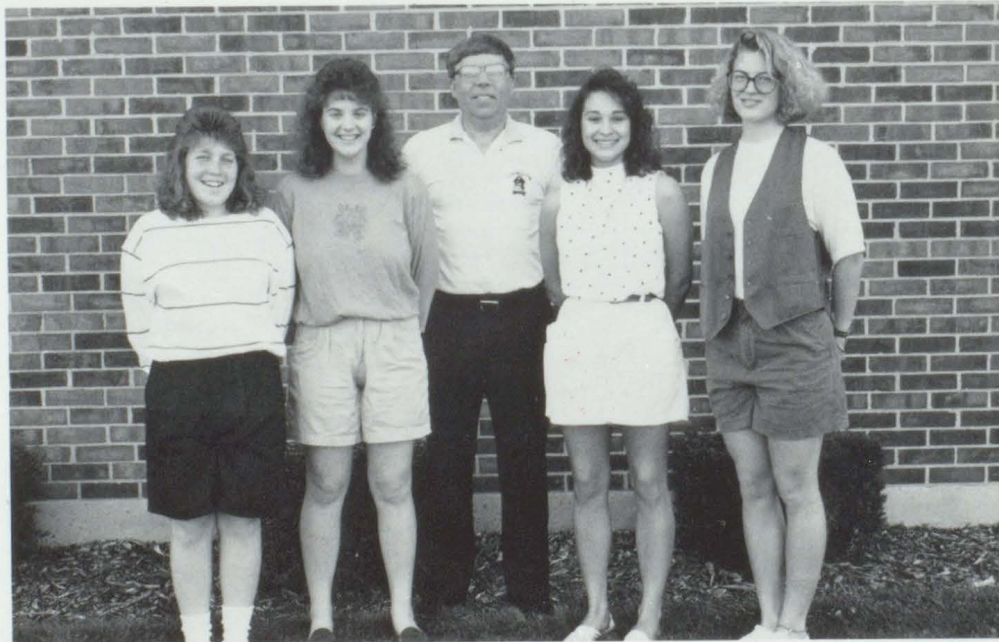

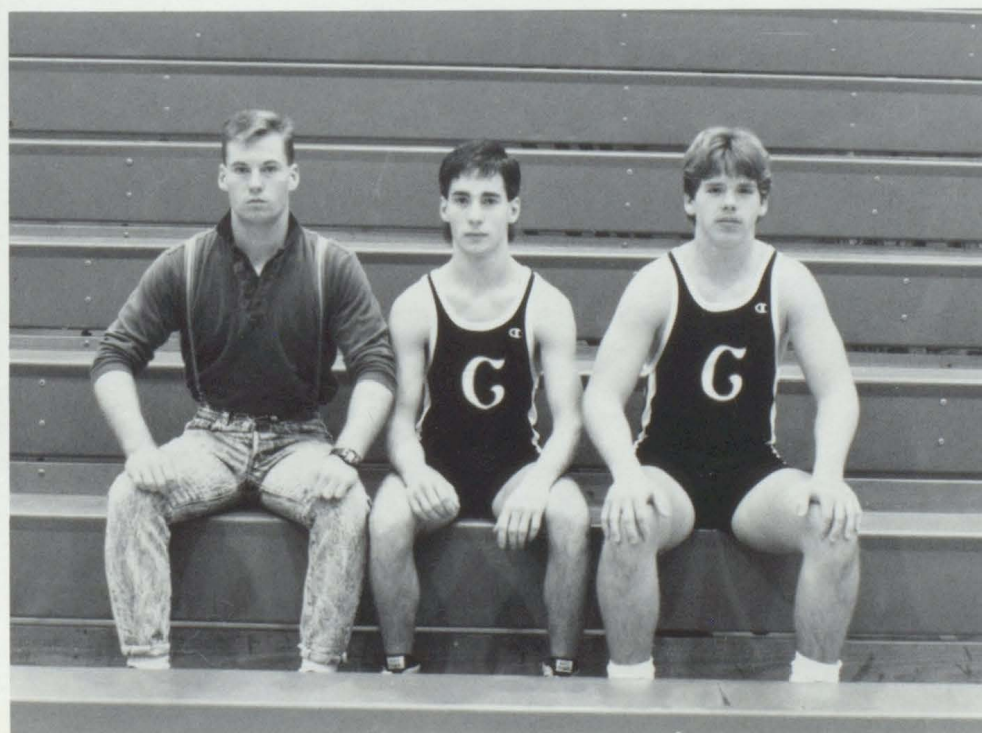
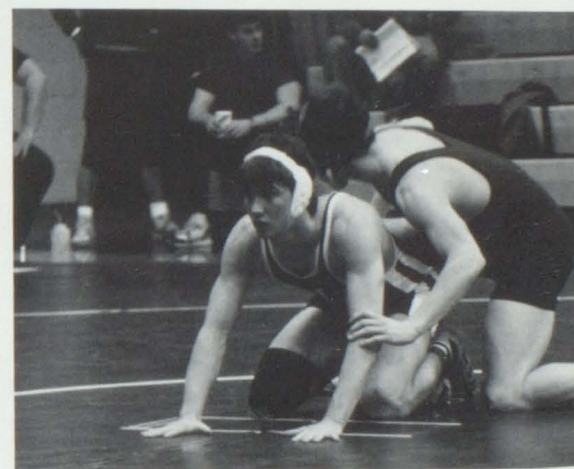
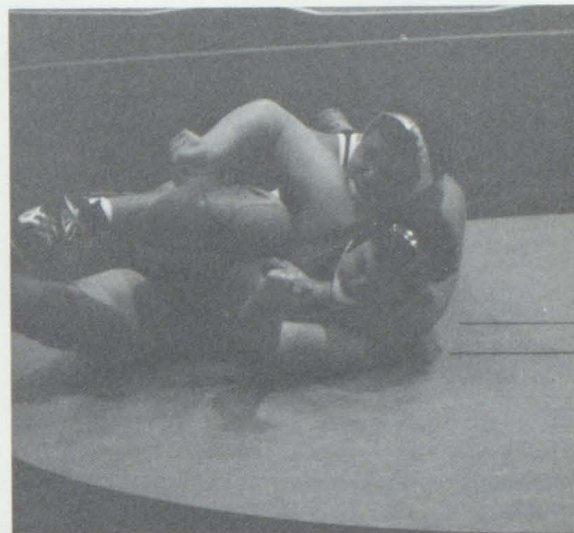
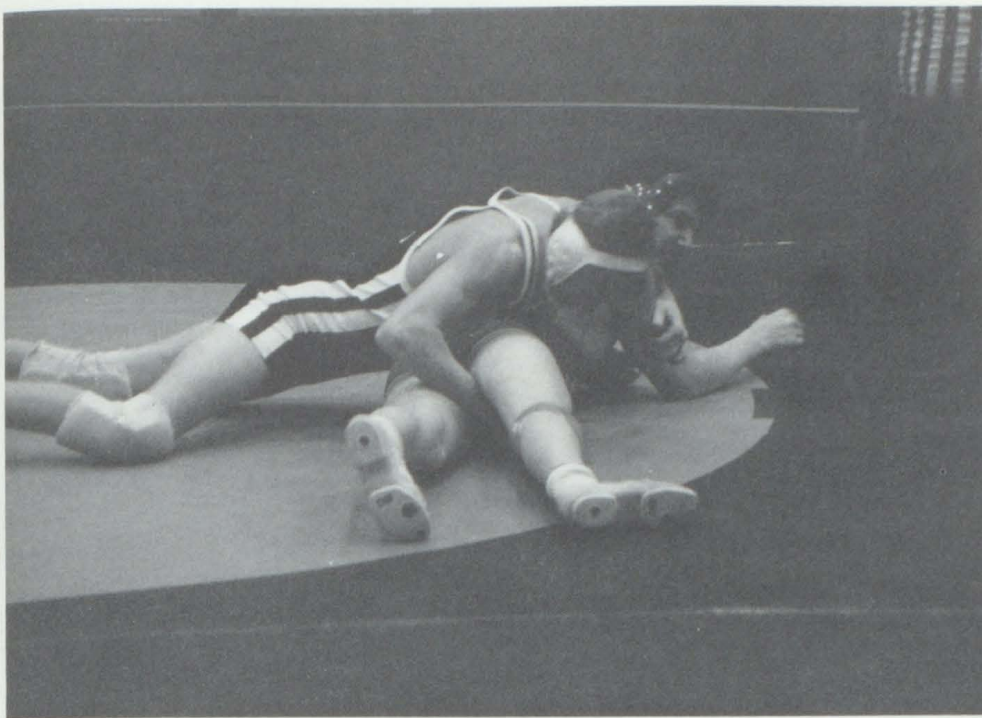
The Covington High School wrestling team consisted of two seniors, three juniors, four sophomores, and three freshman. Our dual meet record was 7 wins and 17 losses.

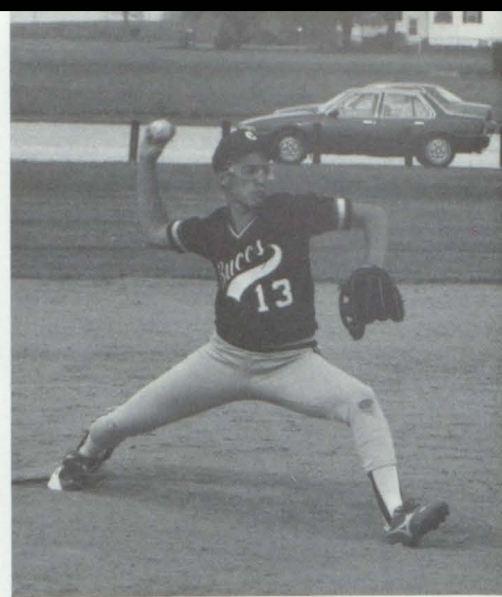

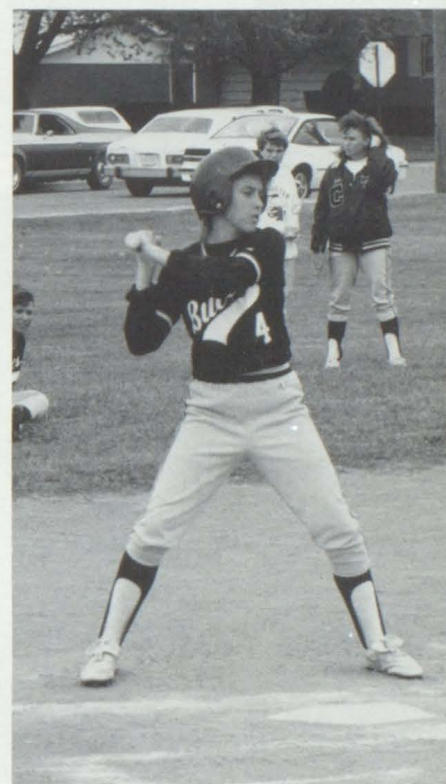
Baseball

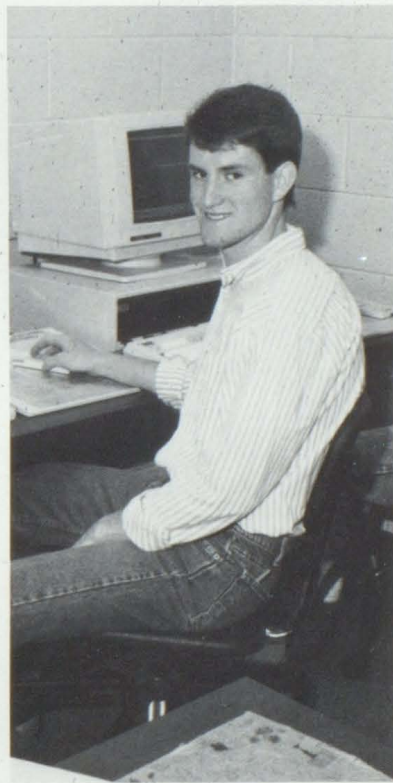
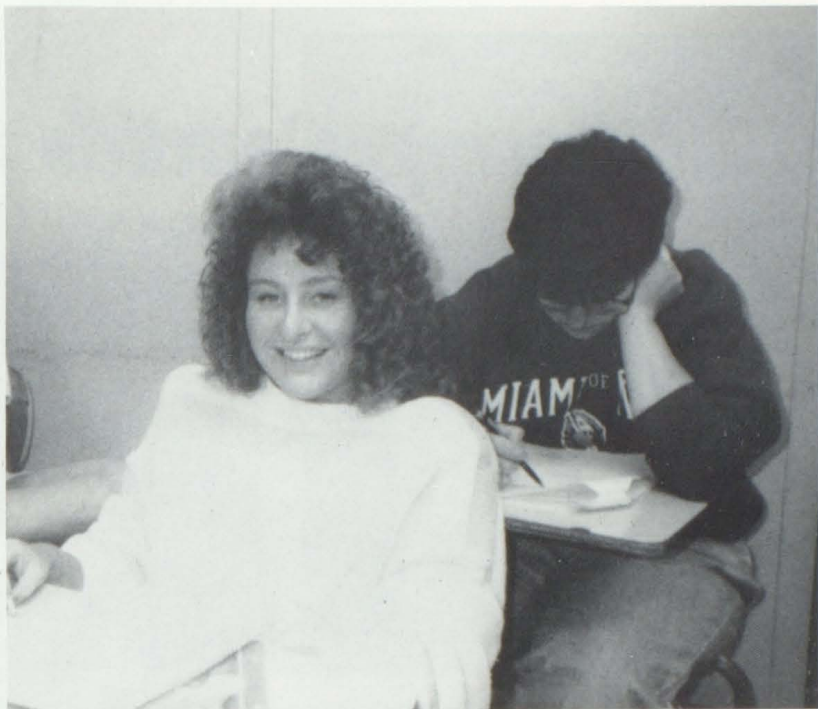




National Honor Society

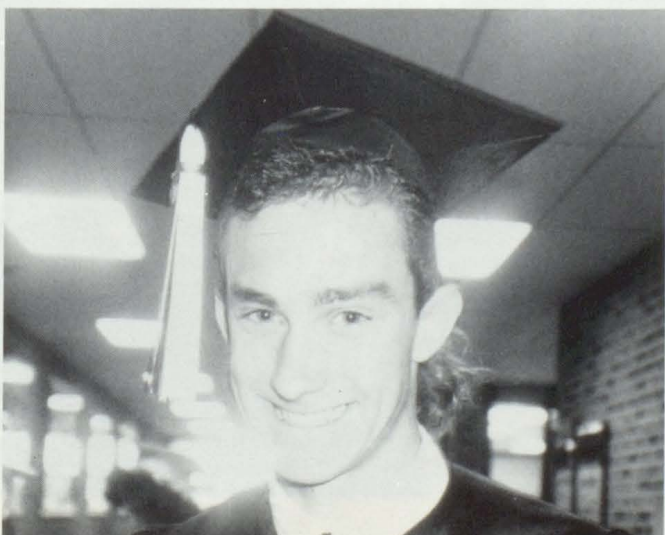
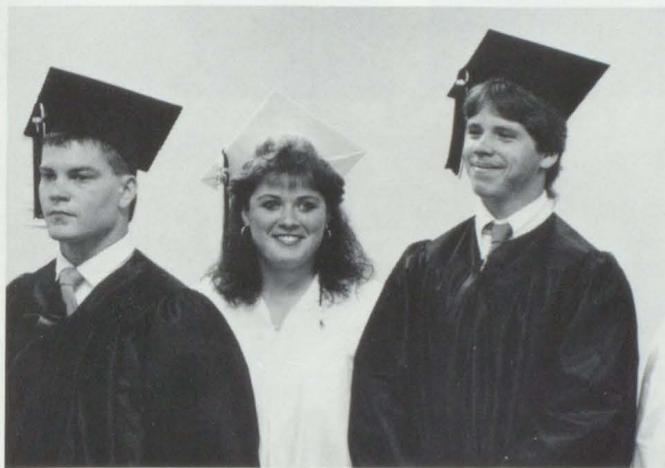


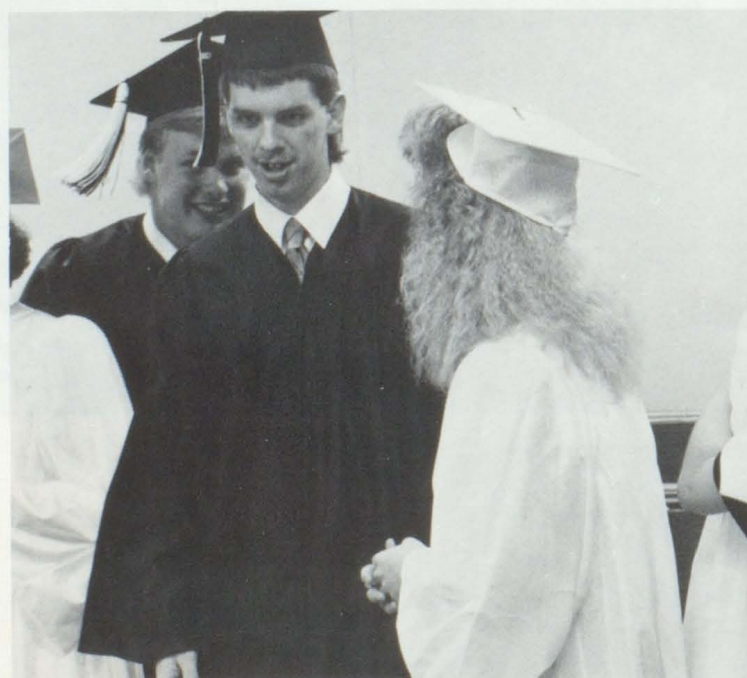
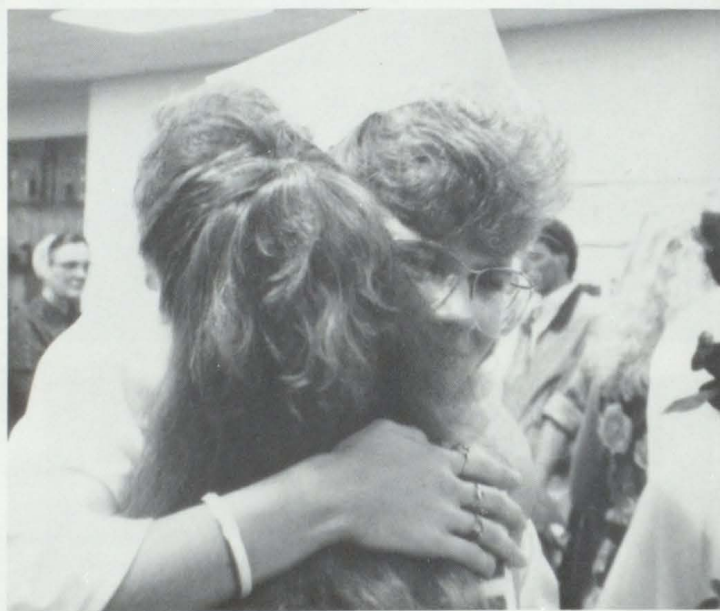
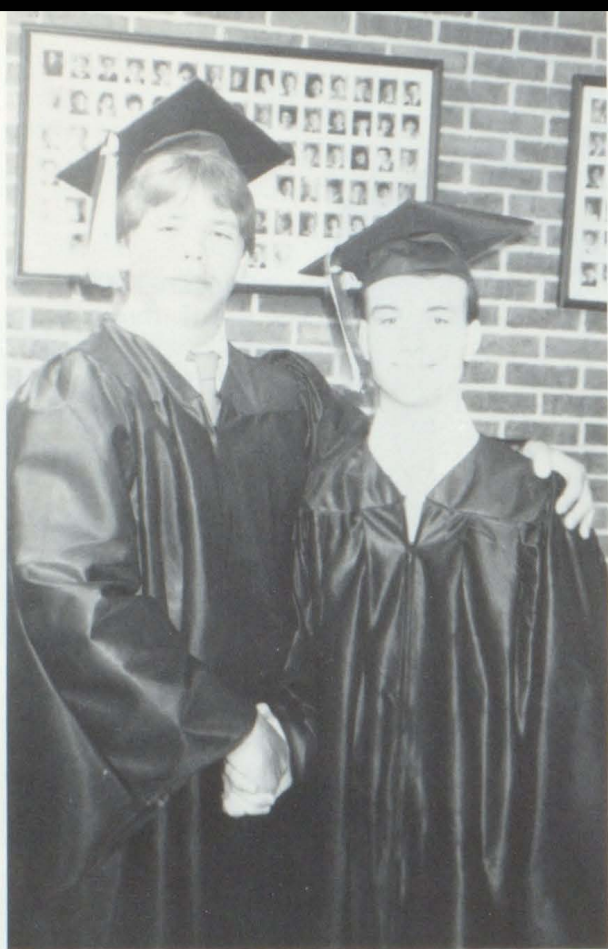


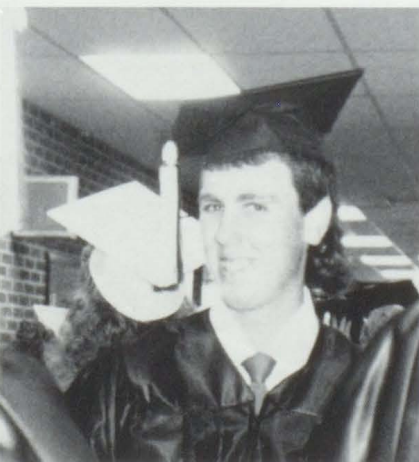
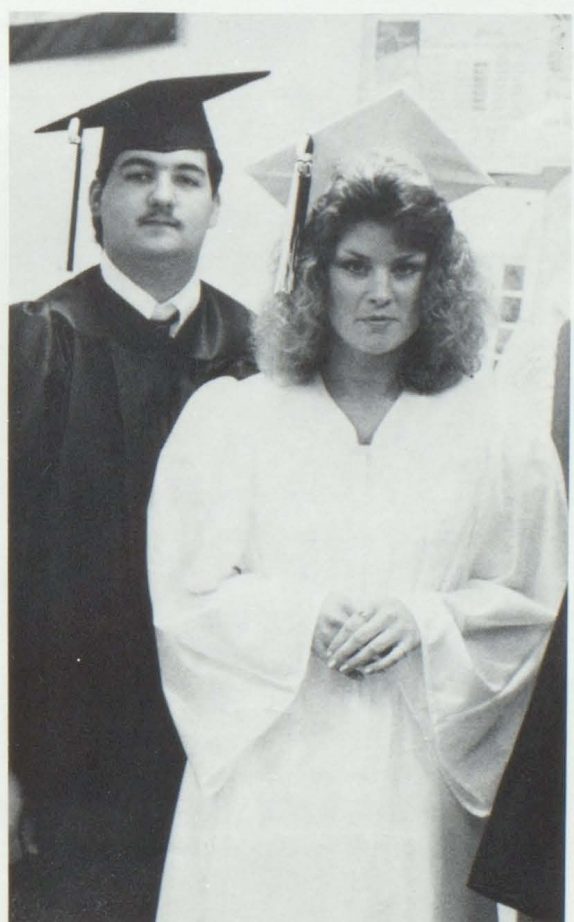
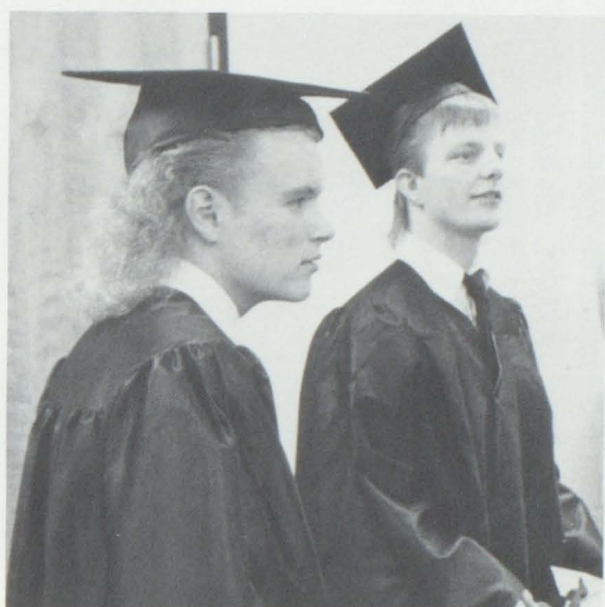
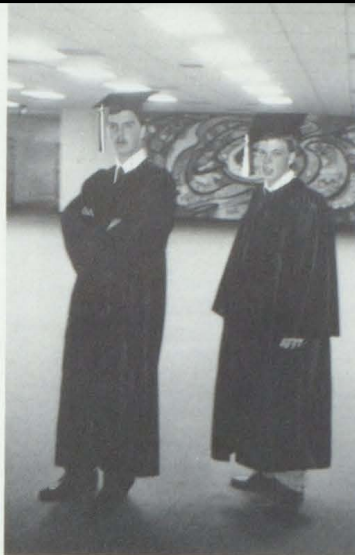
Graduation

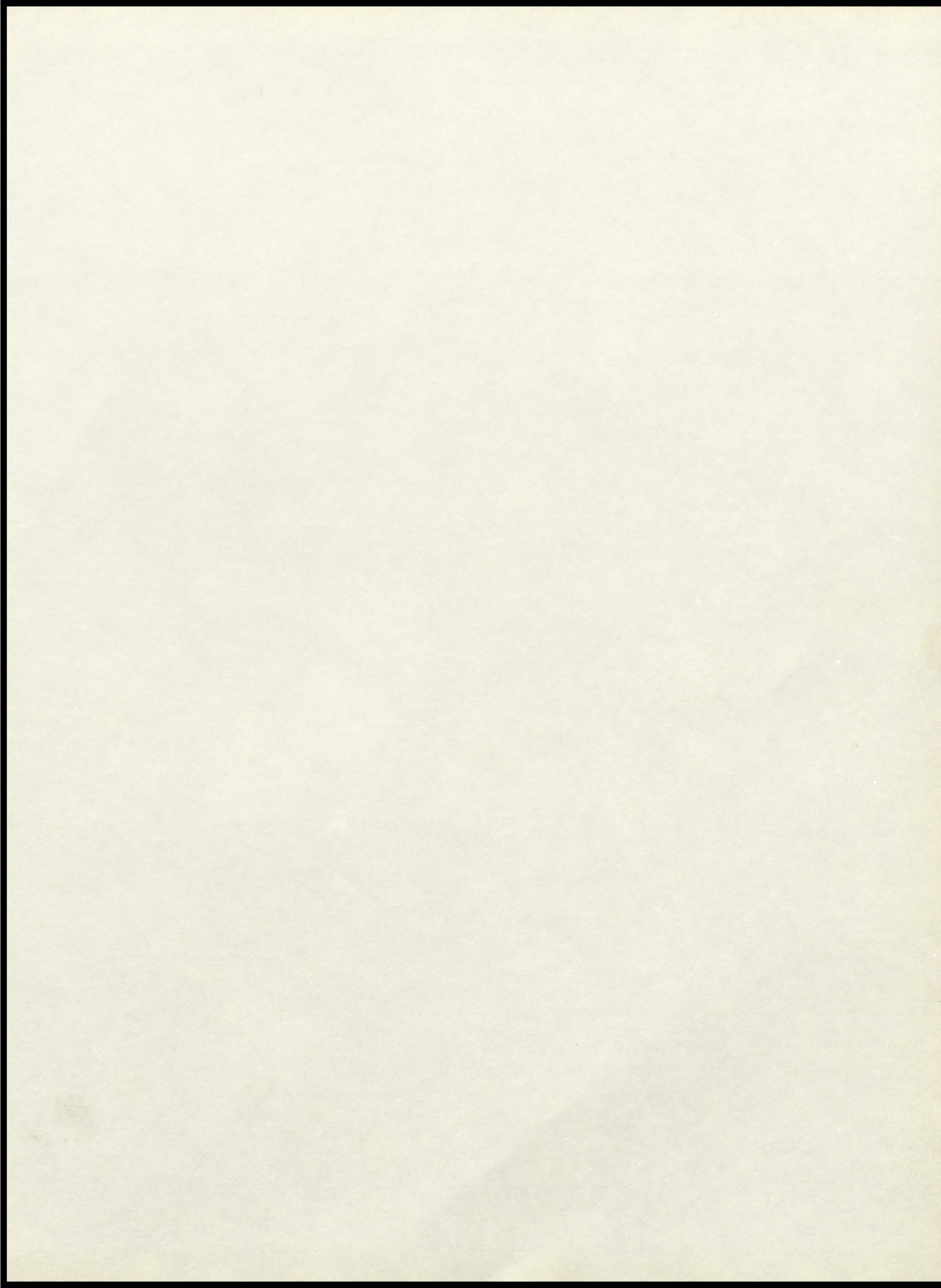


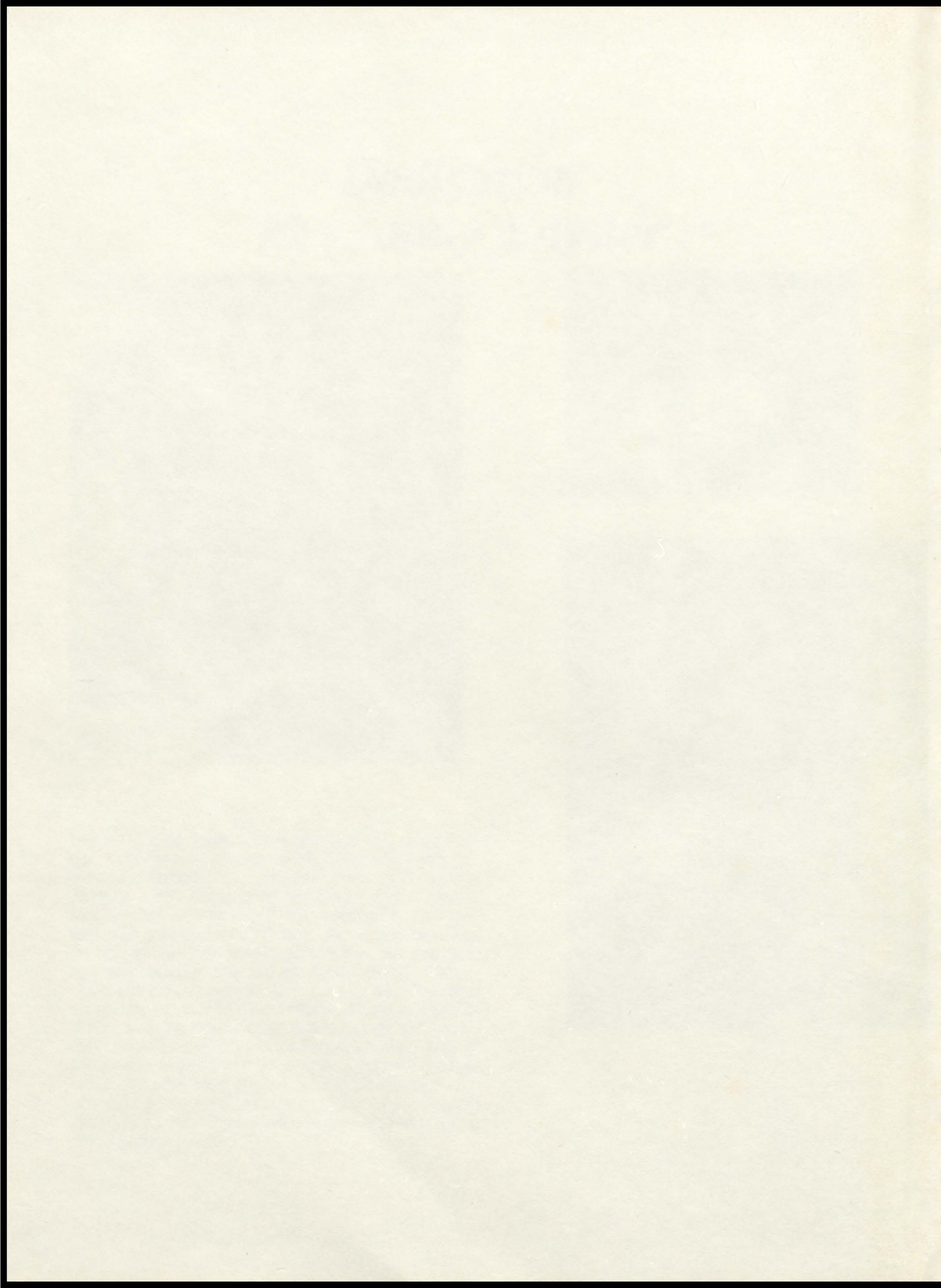


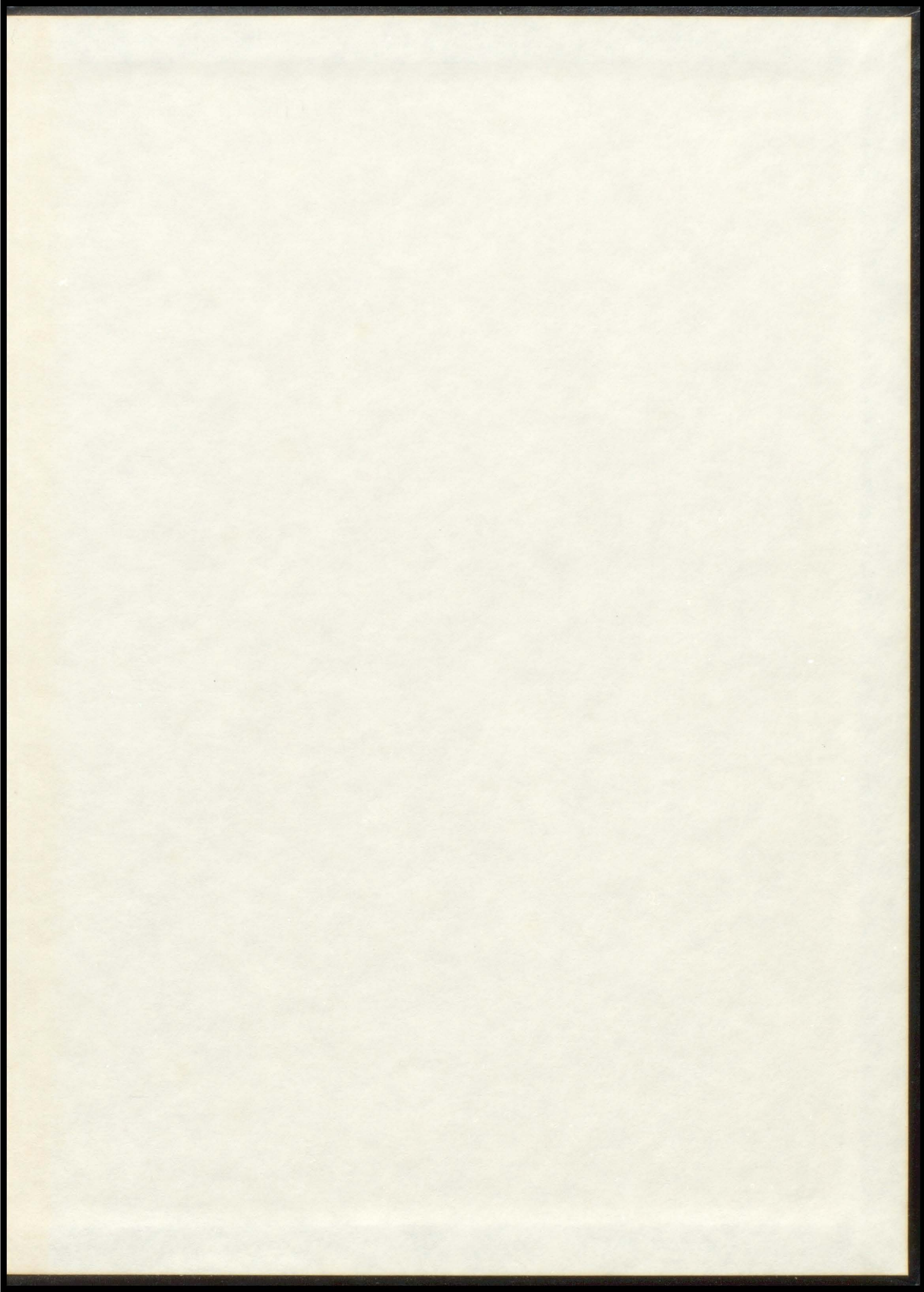
Dedication *Mrs. Judy Snyder*
