








































#### Marching Band~Marching Band~Marching Band~

The boys' cross country team started out slow due to illnesses and injuries but turned it on at the end of the season to have a sensational campaign.



#### Tabitha Robinson:


- John rode my bus, and we used to share funny stories.

John and I stayed up half the night in his barn because his sheep gave birth.














































